Context

Dannieh is a region in North Lebanon extending from the Mediterranean Sea to the highest mountains in the Middle East on a 365 km2 area; with 175,000 recorded inhabitants, not counting the Syrian refugees, estimated at 75000 people, characterized by a mild climate that varies according to the altitude.

Dannieh is characterized by a rich biodiversity and beautiful landscape. It is endowed with the deepest valley in the Levant and the highest mountain, (Qornet es sawda, 3'088 meters above sea level), plains and orchards, cedar forests, rare Lazzab (Juniper) trees, as well as a tempered summer climate that attracts tourists from Lebanon and the Arab region. Snow falls on its mountains during winder, and the area is rich with water resources including rivers, and water fountains. These natural resources are the principal asset of the area. This diversity of weather reflects a distinctive biological richness.

The economy sector in Dannieh has a seasonal aspect. It's a one-dimensional economy that relies in the first place on agriculture 70%. The tourism sector especially in summer is also an important sector in Dannieh, in addition to other sectors. The region is closer to a traditional society and has a lot of challenges.

Despite all these rich characteristics, Dannieh is one of the most marginalized regions in Lebanon and suffers from limited infrastructure, scanty basic services (including education and health services), increasing poverty levels, unemployment as well as limited capacities of local development (such as the diversification of economic activities, and investments). The Syrian crisis putted strain on all economic sectors in Dannieh mainly agriculture, tourism and trade in addition to the severe competition in the labor market and local micro and small investment, the high influx of displaced exacerbated the problems of infrastructure and the need for maintenance and rehabilitation.

In the face of all the aforementioned challenges, the Union of Dannieh Municipalities is working hard to be on the right level of responsibility towards what it is facing. The adoption and the implementation of SDGs was the most certain approach to place the UDM on the global development map, bringing advantages and possibilities to the region. The Thousand Miles path began with the development of a strategic plan based on a participatory approach

to meet the sustainable development goals, what brought new opportunities to promote investment in agriculture and, the region's main economic component, tourism and other fields

The Union believes in the big role of Young people in bringing changes on all levels so he sought to supporting them, highlighting on building capacity, and empowering women, allowing them to innovate and be effective in this journey, in the total absence of the government. The absolute transparency implemented in every aspect of the Union's work, including the budget, awarded him an official certification as a pioneer in this field from the International Association of Transparency.

In 2020, to face the COVID-19 pandemic, the Union of Dannieh Municipalities created an Emergency Response plan from 15 committees of highly educated and specialized young volunteers to respond to the needs of the local community, in collaboration with the Union's 17 municipalities. He relied on the contributions of civil society for funding and support, as well as the use of technology, for data collection and communication, despite the difficult situation in Dannieh, effectively connecting volunteers and civil society and encouraging them to be more active and involved: they attended meetings, suggested ideas, and implemented projects.

Objectives of the experience

In the face of the enormous challenge posed by Corona, as well as a lack of funding due to the country's severe economic crisis, the initiative discovered **community empowerment** as a tool for localizing sustainable development goals and bringing opportunities to the region, as well as a local solution that relies on youth to overcome the crisis. They played a key role in mitigating the crisis, and they went on to become an active body inside the union, participating in project execution and continuing after the crisis was well over.

Methodology

The Union of Dannieh Municipalities had established an Emergency Response Plan with 15 committees of volunteers from youth with a high level of education and specialization. These committees worked to assure the needs of the residents despite the already challenges exacerbated by the crisis as following:

Emergency and Relief Service, Volunteer Doctors Committee, Nurses Committee, Committee for Volunteers for Delivery Services, Call Center Committee, Union Police





Support Committee, Health Committee (sterilization), Media and Communication Committee, Guidance and Orientation Committee, Data and Statistics Committee, Follow-up and Monitoring Committee, The logistical support committee.

Heads of municipalities daily follow-up of municipal cells and deposit them to the Union. A session was held, attended by the council, where it was agreed to establish the Crisis Cell, and approval was obtained from the relevant ministry, the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities. The crisis cell has the power to work on the ground and take the necessary measures depending on the municipal decision.

We have invited the youth to form a Crisis Cell aiming to assist people affected by the lockdown. They were divided according to their specializations and preferences into different committees, (15 committees), each of which has a specific work headed by a coordinator with several volunteers to perform the tasks assigned in a participatory approach. The Union has facilitated for them the necessary equipment, means of transportation, and methods of protection. They were like an orchestra working harmoniously.

Innovation

The initiative can be considered as revolutionary because nothing similar has happened in the area whether during the COVID-19 crisis, or in similar situation that occurred before. It was the result of combined efforts and somehow inspired by successful initiative around the country. The most significant component of this initiative is the young community that has taken major part in the planning and the implementation. Involving the youth was aligned with our previous experiences with SDGs. Besides, this initiative had relied on the use of technology, which is considered an innovation in the area.

Inclusion

The innovation had shade the light on the marginalized people by which we mean people with limited or no income, disable people, women and elderly. It has covered the greater part of area of Dannieh, and addressed the majority of communities there. It had affected almost the whole region, even villages that are not under the Union's umbrella, the priority of work was dedicated to the marginalized groups including the elderly, women, and people with disabilities, 60%, the temporarily affected families 30%, others 10%.





Communication

As mentioned before, this initiative had relied on the use of technology. The use of shared folders and WhatsApp groups, has helped facilitating communication between committees inside the cell on hand and with people on other hand. When necessary, traditional messages were used and members of the cell have created connections and networks with local and residents. All information about the initiative are shared on the website on the Union, and it is accessible by everyone this means that other cities can benefit from our experience and get inspired by the steps followed.

Articulation with other actors

Youth were the main pillar of this initiative, they were able to integrate with other components of the community. It encouraged them to be more active and involved, and it has shown their abilities and skills. They were attending meeting, suggesting ideas and implementing projects.

The Union of Dannieh municipalities has coordinated with the 17 municipalities that were under its umbrella, and has cooperated with active people in the civil society, supported by the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities, as well as the Ministry of Public Health. Locals and residents of Dannieh area have benefited from this initiative in terms PCR tests, follow up ,delivery services, and other services upon needs.

The main obstacle that has hindered our innovation from progress is the lack of awareness of locals and residences about COVID-19. We needed time and effort to convince people to take safety majors, wear masks, sanitize, and apply physical distancing. Moreover, the lockdown has affected people's work and income which made it harder to apply lockdown guidelines imposed by the government. Financing was also a challenge for our innovation because the budget is limited and the needs are excessive. Despites of these challenge, as for the region, the initiative can be considered as very innovative in terms of activities, people involved, and outcomes. It gave the youth the opportunity to play a role in their community and to feel responsible of themselves and others. They are now a part of the Union; they participate in its periodic meetings as well as in proposing development projects. Moreover, the efficiency of the initiative has improved compared to the beginning of the crisis. It is





now more credible and includes more people and cover larger areas. Locals and residents became more cooperative and aware.
